2	1	HH Credit 1	Solid Waste Collection & Disposal <i>Intent: Facilitate segregation of village waste at source, so as to avoid diversion of such waste to land-fills, thereby eliminating associated health hazards</i>	3	Preliminary Review: The IGBC template and submitted narrative states that the village has separate bins for the wet and dry waste and throw it in their respective bins. The wet waste was decomposed in the Ukirds near the village to produce manure. Supporting documents includes photographs of the waste collection and declaration signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) of wet and dry waste handling at 878 household levels with total 3,237 bins. Hence, 1 point is awarded for segregation of waste at household level, 2 points for contract with recycler is pending. However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical Advice: Please submit the following: 1. Please submit details of the centralised collection & sorting area confirming the segregation of biodegradable waste and recyclable waste (plastic & paper waste). 2. Contract with recyclers for plastic and paper waste 3. On-site photographs of dual bins. Final Review: The submitted narrative states that plastic waste and solid waste generated by 640 families is sent to a certified vendor for recycling. Supporting document includes declaration (11/10/2025) signed by Sarpanch and photographs of the dustbins placed in common area. Hence, 1 credit point is awarded for contract for recycling plastic waste. <i>Note: For future submission, please submit contract copy of the plastic waste recycler</i>

Clean Streets Supporting documents includes photographs of individual toilets, clean streets and declaration signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) mentioning the village is taking active measures to conduct fumigation at village level once in every 15 days to control mosquito breeding in Mauje Ekambe. Supporting documents include photographs of individual water tanks, water purifier and taps and declaration letter signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) mentioning that there are 878 families in Mauje Ekambe and 1 drinking water tank with a water storage capacity of 8 lakh litres. The total number of tap connections is 417. Hence, 2 points are awarded for adequate drinking water availability.
				Final Review: The credit point was awarded during preliminary review

Supporting documents include photographs of individual toilets and declaration letter signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) mentioning that there are every individual household has toilet facility and there is no practice of open defecation. The declaration also states that the maintenance and repair of public toilet at Mauje Ekambe is done by Gram Panchayat from time to time through Gram Nidhi / Finance Commission. Hence, 3 points are awarded. However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Please submit the on-site photographs of public toilet. Final Review: The submitted narrative states the availability of public toilets at Ekambe. Supporting documents include photograph of the public toilet for Male and Female. Hence, 1 credit point is awarded.

However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Please clarify/submit the following: 1. On-site interior photographs of Medical shop. 2. Photographs of power supply backup. 3. Photographs of segregation of biomedical waste 4. Log sheet for maintenance of healthcare facility. 5. Declaration letter signed by Sarpanch mentioning the facilities such as no. of doctors, health workers and nurses available in the Clinic.
					Final Review: The submitted narrative states that Government sub-center in Ekambe has 1. One Doctor, one Nurse and one Madatnis and medical shop; (1 point) 2. Inverter backup supply (1 point) Supporting documents include photographs of PHC showing facilities such as access with ramp, beds, doctor's chamber; medical store interior photos; copy of log sheet 2025 of patients visiting the hospital and declaration signed by Sarpanch stating the availability of staff members in the hospital. Also, the project team has submitted a photograph indicating the segregation of biomedical waste in PHC. However, the disposal of the biomedical waste is unclear. Therefore, the credit points for the same cannot be awarded under this credit. Hence, 2 credit points are awarded.

Supporting documents include declaration letter signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) mentioning that gas connection has been distributed to the beneficiaries under Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana at Mauje Ekambe. Hence, 1 point is awarded. However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Please clarify how much percentage of household have gas connection in the village. Final Review: The submitted narrative states that the village has 100% households with gas connection. Supporting documents include declaration from Sarpanch. Hence, 1 credit point is awarded.

Supporting documents include photographs of manure. Hence, 1 point is awarded. However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Please clarify/submit the following: 1. Narrative explaining how the garden waste are composted in the village. 2. Detail of any community level biogas plant or composter. 3. Narrative and Declaration letter signed by Sarpanch explaining the process from collection of wet waste in the village to composting and using as fertilizer for agriculture.
					Final Review The submitted narrative states that the village has a biogas plant, all the compost generated from wet waste is used for agriculture in Ekambe. Supporting documents include declaration (11/10/2024) signed by Sarpanch, photographs of biogas plant. However, it is still unclear how the garden waste is composted at community/centralised level. For future submission, clearly define the strategies adopted by the villager to cater to the garden waste and food waste generated.

Supporting documents include declaration letter signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) mentioning that the Gram Panchayat is now open defecation free and fine provision is present. However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical Advice: Please submit the following: 1. Please submit details of prohibition of manual scavenging with supporting documents or photographs. Final Review: The submitted narrative states that third party contract has been awarded to collect the human waste from the toilets. Supporting documents include declaration from Sarpanch. Hence, 1 credit point is awarded.

Supporting documents include declaration letter signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) mentioning that at Mauje Ekambe, the wet waste was decomposed near the village to produce manure and it is used as fertilizer for agriculture. Hence, 2 points are awarded. Final Review: The credit point was awarded during preliminary review.

Final Review: The submitted narrative states that the project has following basic amenities - 1. Milk Bank 2. Panchayat Office 3. Place of worship 4. Grinder Mill Also, during the in-person site visit, IGBC team has observed Anganwadi Center in the project. Supporting documents include photographs of the above mentioned facilities. Hence, additional 3 points are awarded under this credit

However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Kindly clarify with photographs the following: 1. Connected drinking water supply in the school 2. Declaration letter signed by Sarpanch mentioning the details of teachers present in the schools. Final Review During the in-person site audit, IGBC team has observed the drinking water facility available in school. Also, the submittals include photographs indicating that total 8 teachers are available in the school. Therefore, 2 points are awarded under this credit.

Photographs of Inter and Intra village commuting facilities (autos, tempo) Final Review The project team has responded to the technical advices raised during the preliminary review by submitting photographs of auto rickshaws used as inter & intra village facilities. Also, during the in-person site visit, IGBC team has observed the seating area with constructed shed nearby (approx. 30m) as well as the shade of trees over the seating area of bus stop. This meets the credit requirements. Therefore, 3 points are awarded under this credit.
3	VI Credit 4	Livestock Management <i>Intent: Provide basic veterinary health care facilities to ensure health of livestock and hence sustain the livelihood patterns.</i>	3	Preliminary Review: The IGBC template and submitted narrative states that the project has the following: 1. One Veterinary Dispensary Unit Supporting documents include photograph of closed Veterinary Dispensary Unit and declaration letter signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/24) mentioning 1 veterinary clinic is present in the village where doctors are regularly present and provide veterinary medical services. However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Kindly submit the following: 1. Interior photographs of the veterinary clinic 2. Photographs of the mini dairy or cold storage or system for storage of food stock if any. 3. Photographs of fodder bank if available. Final Review The project team has submitted photographs indicating storage and management of fodder, photographs of dairy, photographs of sugarcane storage. Also, during the in-person site visit, IGBC team has observed the veterinary clinic present in the village. This meets the credit requirements. Therefore, 3 points are awarded under this credit.

It is observed that out of the mentioned 6 signages to be installed in the technical advice during preliminary review, the project team has installed 3 signages. Therefore, 1 point is awarded and 1 point is ascertained with a benefit of doubt for this project only. <i>Note: For future submissions, the project team shall install at least 4 signages from the above mentioned list to meet the credit compliance.</i>

However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Please submit details of availability of 70 liters per capita per day and quality of water to meeting CWC standards. Final Review The project team has submitted a declaration letter by Sarpanch stating that total 640 households are present in the village and each household gets 200 Liters of water per day. This does not suffice the credit requirement of 1 point. Therefore, the credit point cannot be awarded under this credit.

Final Review The project team has submitted photographs of under construction underground sewerage network along with a declaration letter signed by the Sarpanch stating that multiple septic tanks are constructed to discharge sewerage water. The declaration further states that all the households are connected to underground sewerage network and septic tanks are also constructed wherever necessary. This meets the credit requirements. Therefore, 3 points are awarded under this credit.
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3	VI Credit 9	Green Cover in Village <i>Intent: Protect trees & enhance green cover in village so as to retain habitat and biodiversity</i>	3 Preliminary Review: The IGBC template and submitted narrative states that the project has the following: 1. 30% of village to be under green cover (excluding agricultural land) Supporting documents include declaration letter signed by Sarpanch (dated 10/11/2024) mentioning that a total of 600 trees have been planted in Mauje Ekambe in the year 2022-23. Moreover, species details has been mentioned. Hence, 2 points are awarded. However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Please confirm whether periodic plantation activities are carried out at the village level. Final Review: The project team has responded to the technical advice raised during the preliminary review by submitting a declaration letter stating that plantation drive is carried out in the village once in a year and photographs of the villagers while planting trees. This meets the credit requirement. Therefore, additional 1 point is awarded under this credit.

Therefore, 1 point is ascertained with a benefit of doubt for this project only considering that the pit has the capacity of collecting at least 25% of total run off and also, considering that a well is provided with proper barricade (Jali on top).

However, additional clarification is required as mentioned below: Technical advice: Please clarify/submit the following: 1. A letter from Sarpanch stating the total connected load and percentage of household connected to power supply through a combination of grid and non grid sources. 2. Copy of the electricity bill. 3. Photographs of street lights. Final Review The project team has responded to the technical advices raised during preliminary review by submitting photographs of the LED bulbs installed for street lighting, energy meters installed in front of every household in the village, electricity bill copy for Public Water Works Category as well as Gram Panchayat office, a declaration letter stating that 100% of the households in the village are connected to the grid power supply and a declaration letter stating that street lights are connected with grid power as well as solar power (wherever there is shortage of grid power). This meets the credit requirement. Therefore, additional 1 point is awarded under this credit.

					Final Review The project team has submitted only photographs of the solar power installed in the project. However, the percentage of village demand covered by the installed solar panels is unclear. Also, in the submittals it is declared that a few street lighting bulbs are operated on solar, wherever grid power is not reachable. Therefore, the credit points cannot be awarded.

Final Review The submittals include a declaration letter signed y the Sarpanch stating that 100% of the street lighting bulbs installed in the project are LED. Also, the same declaration states that the LED bulbs procured in the households are LED, however, the percentage of the same is unclear. Further, the project team has submitted a declaration letter stating that 100% of the households have individual energy meters installed. This meets the credit requirement of additional 2 points for the following: a. At least 25% of street lighting is LED/ CFL/ T5 lights b. Metering for 100% of the households Therefore, 2 points are awarded under this credit.

Also, the project team has submitted photographs indicating use of cloth bags by the villagers and the signage indicating 'do not litter'.
